They were to trust God every day for new food. But some people gathered extra manna, even though God said it would rot overnight.





Sure enough, yesterday's manna was full of maggots -- except on Sabbath day. On that special seventh day the people rested and ate yesterday's manna.




God looked after the Israelites in the desert. He gave them food and water -- and protected them from




Moses was with God on the mountain for forty days. God wrote the Ten Commandments on two slabs of stone. He told Moses how He wanted His people to live.


- 6. "You shall not murder.




The other ten spies were afraid of the strong cities and giants in the land. "We can't take the land," they moaned.
