"Master, Master, we are perishing!"



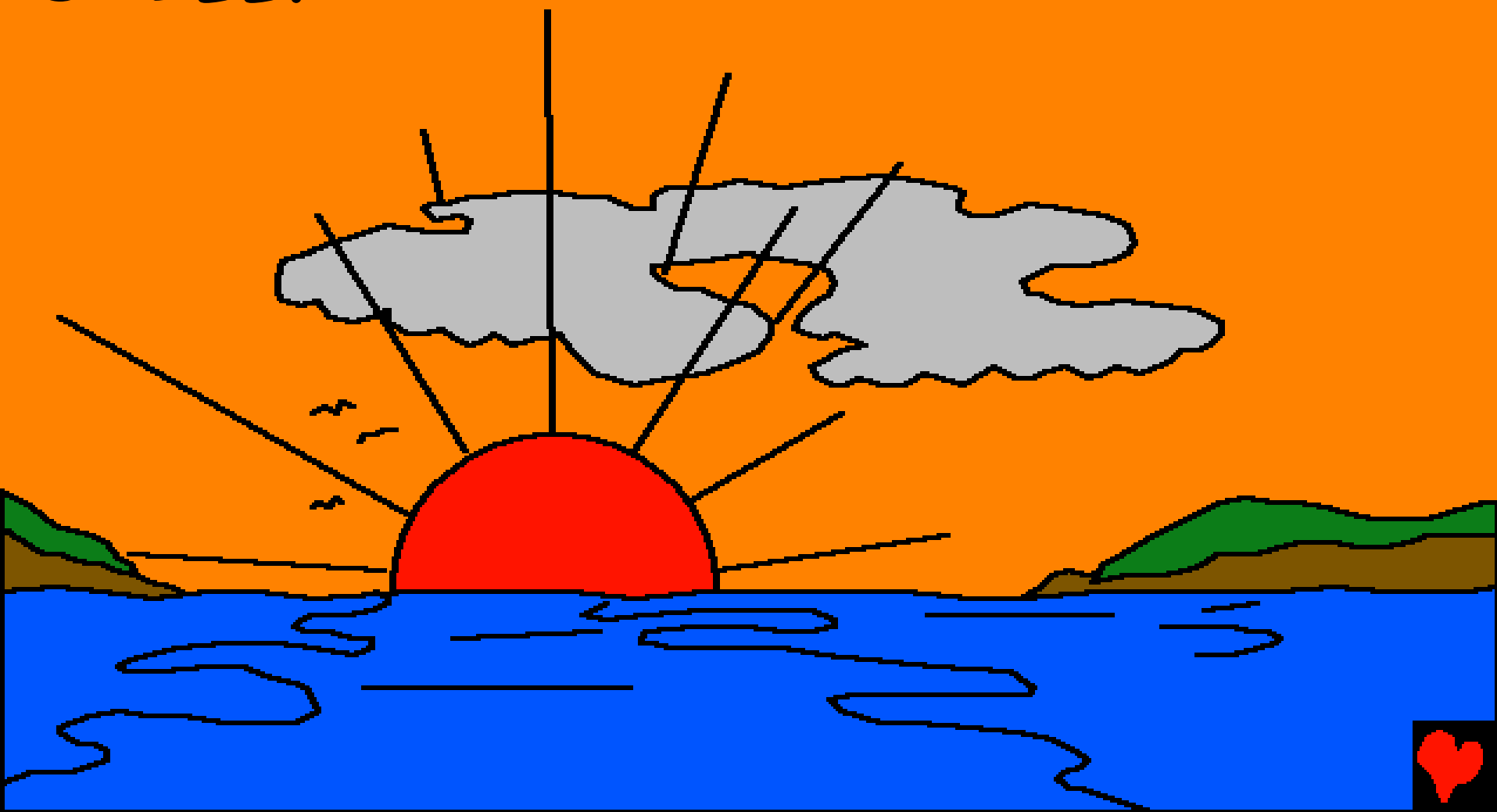
"Why are you fearful, O you of little faith?" Jesus asked His disciples.



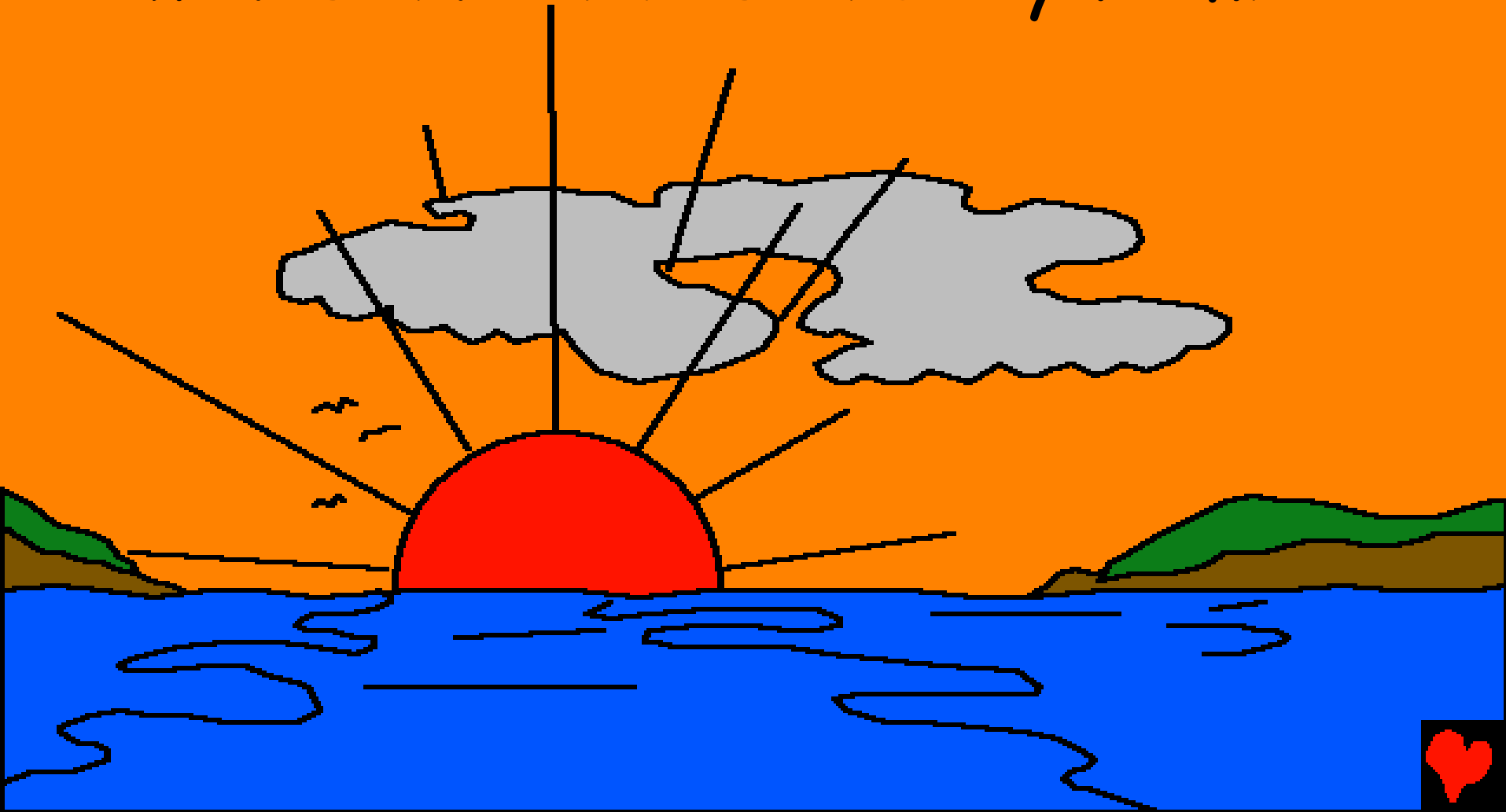
Then Jesus commanded the wind to

lie down and be still . . .



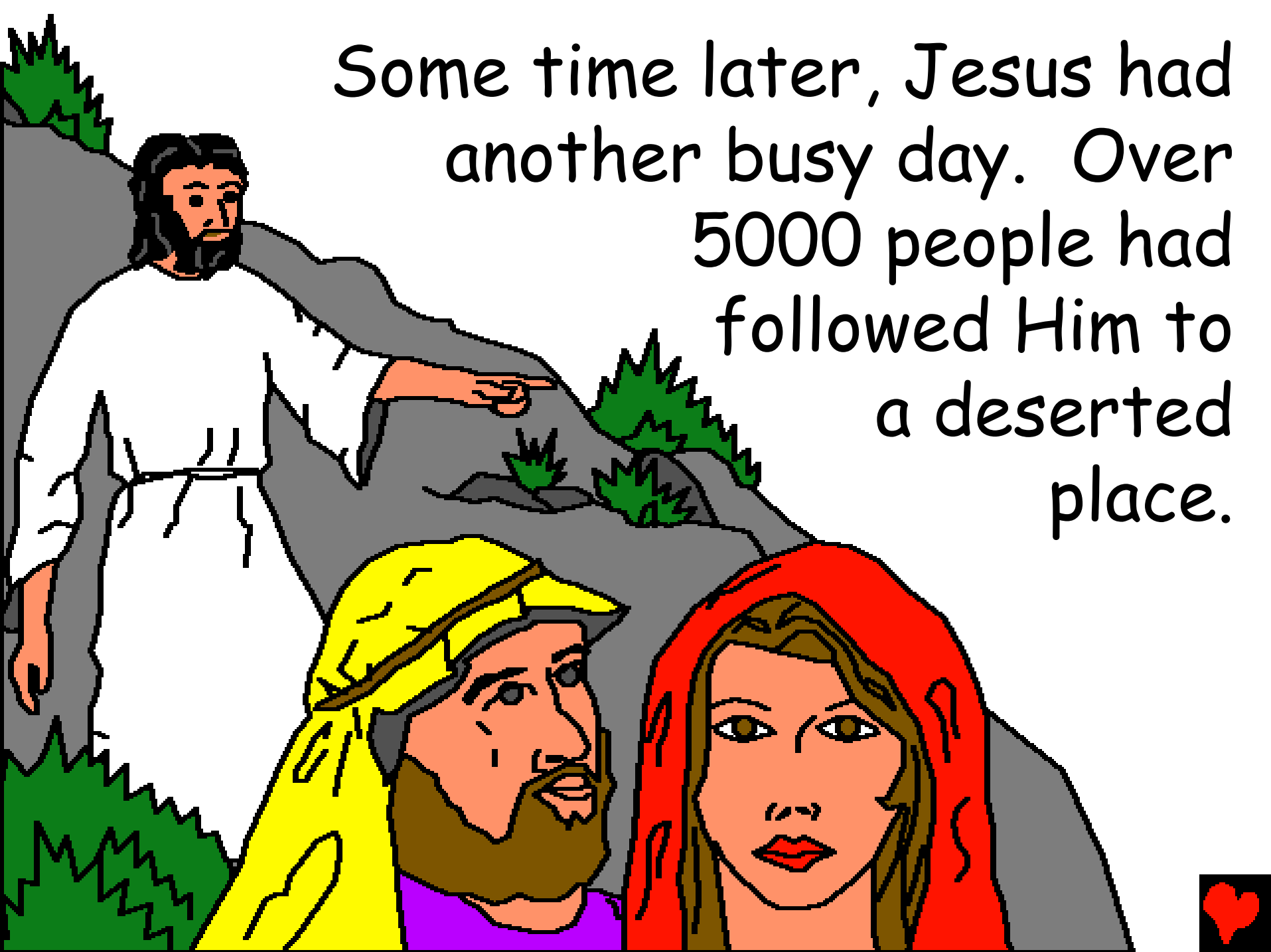
AND THE WIND CALMED ... THE

STILL.



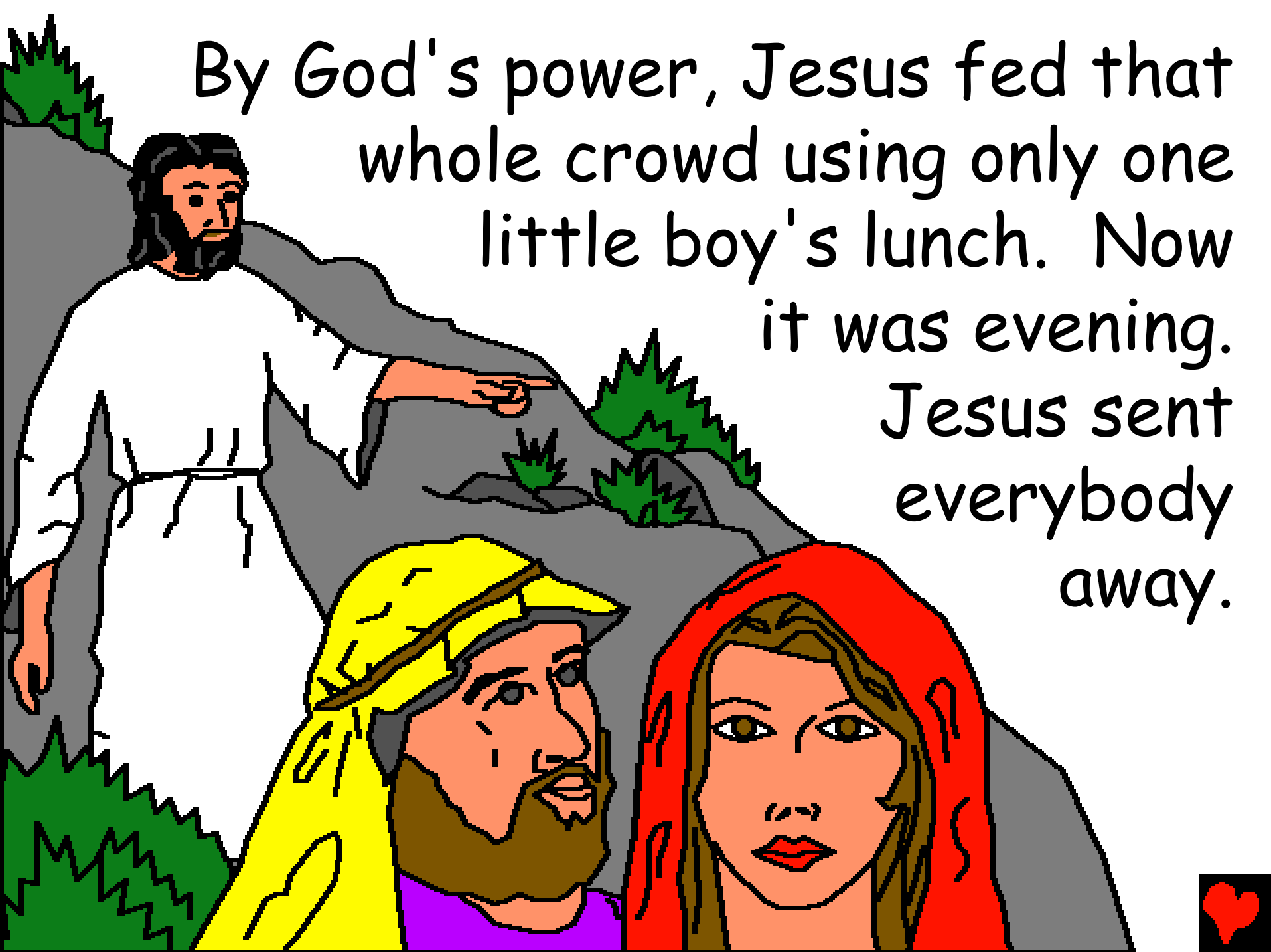
The disciples marveled, saying,

winds and the sea obey Him!"



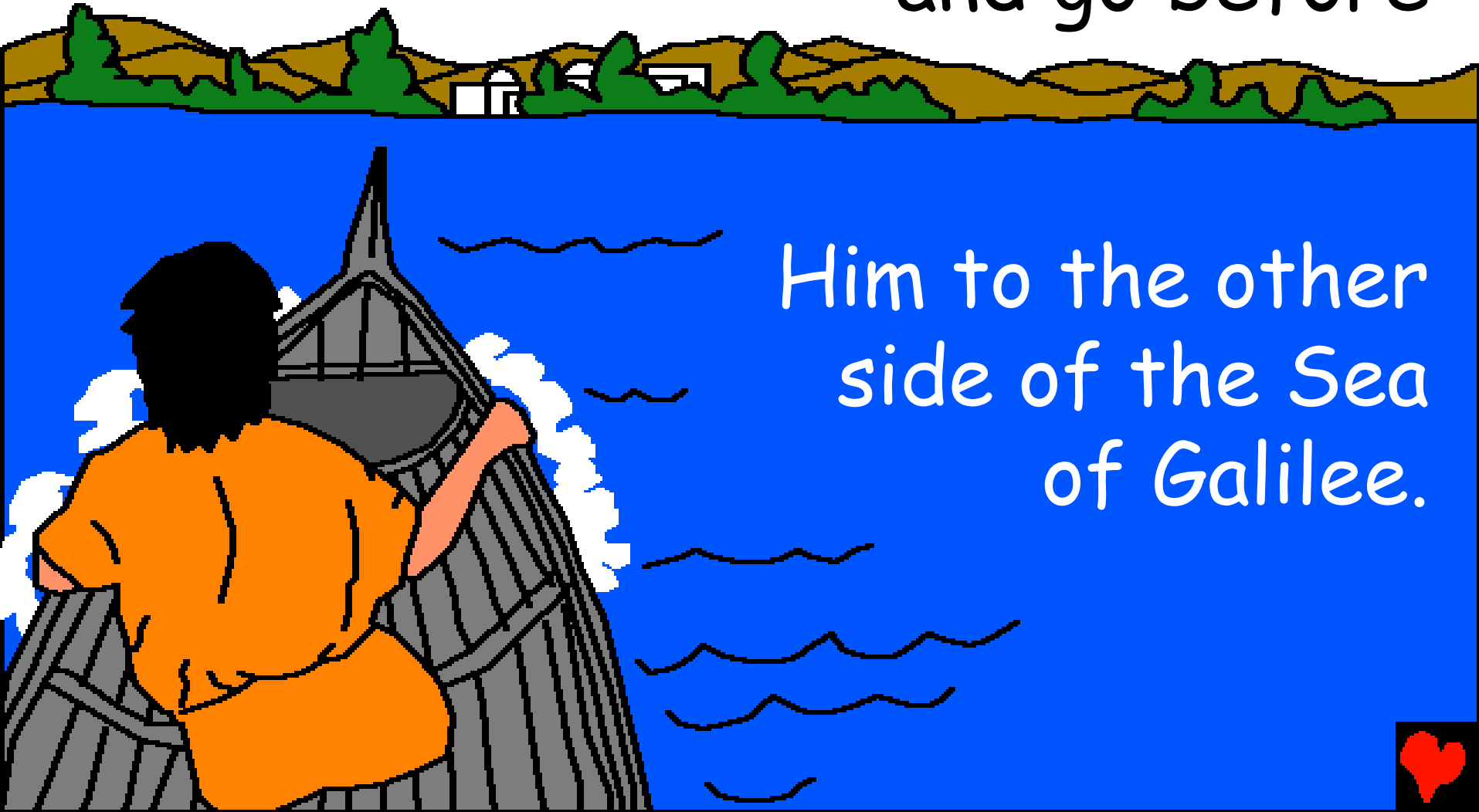
Some time later, Jesus had another busy day. Over 5000 people had followed Him to a deserted place.

windstorm.



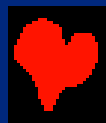


The storm

toward Jesus.

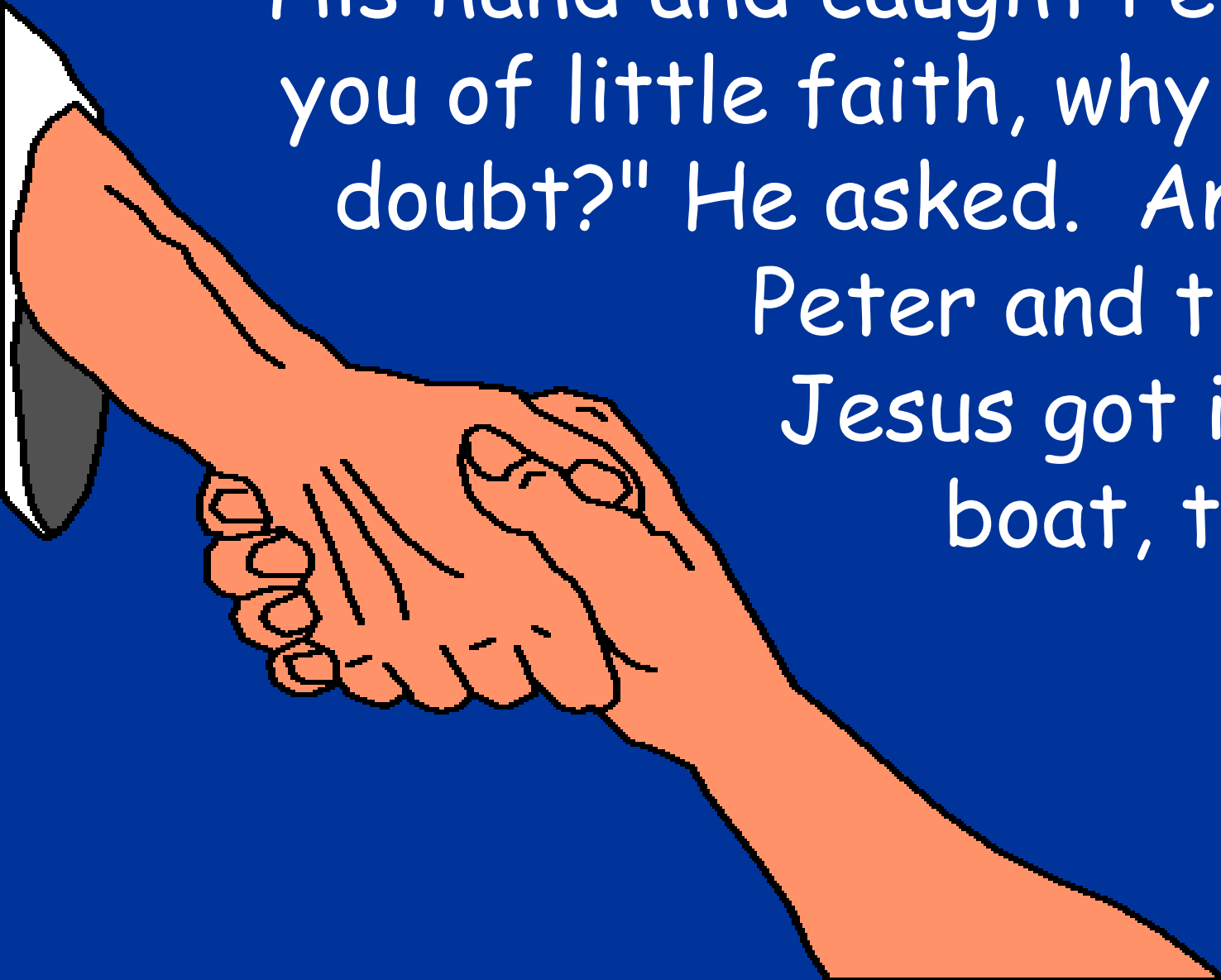




But when he saw the wind swirling, Peter was afraid, and began to sink. He cried, "Lord, save me!"
